

SUMMER SCHOOL

Grades 2-5

Standards for summer school will comply with the State Department of Education approved guidelines as listed in Bulletin 741.

The principal shall use the criteria set for promotion in determining the student's placement after receiving the summer school records.

Grades 6-8

The Lafayette Parish Summer School Program's time requirement at the middle school grades 6-8 shall include 120 hours. The students shall attend four hours a day for six weeks. The principal at the base school shall use the criteria set for promotion in determining the student's placement after receiving the summer school records.

Grades 9-12

Students in Lafayette Parish high schools whose performance in basic-skills areas is below grade level are now being taught in basic courses, designed to bring about improvement in reading, writing and computational skills. The student who fails one of these basic courses has the option of repeating the course either during a succeeding semester or session or during summer school. Students unable to meet minimum requirements for receiving credit in basic courses will then be referred to the placement committee for review and possible entrance into the pupil appraisal system. Students who fail a course taught at regular or advanced levels also have the option of repeating the course during a regular semester or session or during summer school.

High School students shall be granted credit for satisfactory completion of courses taken in State approved summer schools.

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
